



Used Monitor Grading Rules

The 5 standard grading rules are as follows:

- 1) **Excellent** - Good as NEW (some are in fact from sites where they have barely ever been used or they may be near-new trade-ins from recently upgraded systems) – *recommended for CRITICAL system user's where graphics quality is important.*
- 2) **Very Good** - suitable for general use and indication is that there is LOTS of life left –*recommended for semi-critical users or systems getting frequent use.*
- 3) **Good** - usable and indication is that they will give good service for many hours of use –*recommended for systems with MODEST use and moderate graphics quality is acceptable.*
- 4) **Fair** - usable but brightness, or focus, or contrast, or physical condition may not be particularly good – *recommended for BUDGET system where the use is casual and visual strain is not likely to be a problem.*
- 5) **Poor** –quite usable - may benefit from technical adjustments – *recommended for BUDGET buyers or those with the skills to make appropriate technical adjustments.*

All monitors come with at least a 7 day limited warranty. Additional warranty can be purchased if desired. Warranty is RTB (return to CASA, freight pre-paid) + RRR (repair or replace or refund).

Used monitors are PRICED according to technical CONDITION + SIZE + BRAND + PHYSICAL condition + AGE and technical SPECIFICATION.

Prices include the original or standard "signal" cables. Special Cables, for Macintosh, Sun etc, are available upon request.

"Mains" cables are additional if required - prices, dependant upon length and style, range from \$5+GST
